## GIANT DRAGONFLY

Scientists recently found the Giant Dragonfly in wetlands near Nabiac and Seal Rocks. This is the first sighting in many years.

## **GIANT DRAGONFLY FACTS**

- it is the third largest species of dragonfly in the world
- it is very rare because when wetlands are destroyed it loses its home
- The larvae or young dragonfly burrow deep into the ground and can live as larvae for 10 years or more. Adults only live a few months.

## WHAT MAKES THEM SPECIAL?

Dragonflies catch and eat their food while flying. They can eat over 100 mosquitoes per day!

Dragonflies were on earth before the dinosaurs.

A dragonfly's eye is made of thousands of tiny eyes. They can see everywhere except right behind them!

Dragonflies can fly forwards, backwards, up, down and sideways - like a helicopter!


